WINTER REMINDERS

SIDEWALK MAINTENANCE

The City Ordinance requires property owners to clear snow from all sidewalks within 10 hours of receiving snow. If you are headed south for the winter, please arrange to have the sidewalk in front of your property cleared after it snows. Please be considerate of the people who walk on the sidewalks and senior citizens who need help clearing their sidewalks.



CLEARING DRIVEWAYS

The City Ordinance prohibits blowing or shoveling snow into the streets. Residents or contractors can be fined for leaving piles of snow in the street. Frozen snow piles cause a hazard to motor vehicles.



FIRE HYDRANTS

Do you have a fire hydrant in the right-of-way of your property? If you do, please be sure to clear the snow away from it so that Fire Department crews would have access to it if necessary.



NO PARKING 2AM-6AM

For City crews to safely clear streets during the winter months and to allow for the easy passage of emergency vehicles, the winter parking ban went into effect on November 1st. Per City Ordinance, NO PARKING is allowed on any City Street between the hours of 2AM-6AM. Violators will be ticketed. Please call the Police Department at (517) 647-4111 with questions.

INCOME TAX REMINDER

Estimated tax payments were due January 31st. 2024 tax forms can be found at City Hall or online at www.portland-michigan.org. **Tax returns are due April 30th, 2025.** The City of Portland Income Tax applies to people who work or live in the City limits. WINTER SHUT OFF PROTECTION

Michigan law offers winter shut off protection during the heating season (November 1-March 31) for eligible low-income and senior citizen electric utility customers.

Low-Income Customers: Must have a household income at or below 150% of the Poverty Level or receive Food Stamps, Medicaid, or assistance from a State Emergency Relief Program. Eligibility requires enrolling in a winter protection payment plan with monthly payments equal to 7% of the estimated annual bill.

Senior Citizens: Must be 65 or older and a customer of the City's Electric Utility.
